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

The Sacrament of the Altar

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church teaches and believes that through the body and blood of Jesus Christ, offered under bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, God gives to His children the forgiveness of sins. Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.

- **If you are a member at an LCMS parish**, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.
- **If you are a visitor** and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.
- **Distribution** - If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow, and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

- Hearing assistive devices for use during worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms & **Nursery** for active children are located to the left of the Narthex as you enter the church.
- The **Cry Room** provides a quiet place for mothers and very young children, located to the right of the Narthex as you enter the church.

The Glory of the Lord Returns to the Temple in the Boy Jesus

In the days of Solomon, the Lord dwelt among His people in the temple. The glory of the Lord filled the house of the Lord in the form of a cloud (1 Kings 8:6–13). Now Jesus, who is the glory of the Lord in the flesh, enters the temple to show that He Himself is the everlasting temple and dwelling place of God (Luke 2:41–52). Our young Lord, true man, subject to Mary and Joseph, reveals Himself also to be true God, whose father is not Joseph but the Almighty Father in heaven. Jesus does this at the time of the Passover. For He came to be the sacrificial Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Even as He was found by His parents after three days, so He would later rise from the dead on the third day that the favor of God might rest also upon us. It is by these mercies of God that we present our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God through Christ (Rom. 12:1–5).

Hymn of the Day

Within the Father's House

LSB 410

What an honor it would be to rub elbows with the theological doctors of the Church and serve the monarch of the nation! That was the life of James Russell Woodford (1820–1885), this hymn's author. As a priest in the Church of England, Woodford showed exemplary scholarship and pastoral wisdom. His exceptional gifts led to service as an Honorary Chaplain to Queen Victoria. Education was a particular focus of Woodford's, and he established a theological college where twelve students lived and were trained for work in the Church. His contributions to commentaries and sermon collections indicate that Woodford took seriously the study of God's Word. He delved into Scripture so that the living Word would be heard and read by many. The framework of this hymn is neatly divided into three sets of two stanzas each. In stanzas 1 and 2 Woodford provides a straightforward description of the scene. The first words of the hymn — “Within the Father's house” — make us curious to know who is in the house and what kind of house this is. Stanzas 3 and 4 get to the heart of the matter. In stanza 4 Woodford uses the word “epiphany,” which means to make manifest or to show brightly. After singing the objective statements of stanzas 1–4 the hearer, the singer, is brought personally into the account of Jesus in the temple through the use of the pronouns “our” and “us” and “we.” The truths of this hymn are now appropriated to us. Stanza 5 moves directly into stanza 6; there is no punctuation dividing them. The Holy Spirit uses the Word of God and the water of Baptism to connect you who are described as “a temple of the Holy Spirit” to Jesus, the temple incarnate.
