Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.

- If you are a member at an LCMS parish, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.
- If you are a visitor and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.
- **Distribution** If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow, and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

- Hearing assistive devices for use during worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms & **Nursery** for active children are located to the left of the Narthex as you enter the church.

Faith Comes By Hearing the Word of Christ

"The kingdom of God is not coming with signs to be observed" (Luke 17:20). You must use your ears and not your eyes. For God's kingdom in this world is one of faith, and faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ. The people of Israel, however, wanted to walk not by faith but by sight. When Moses delayed



in coming down the mountain, they decided to make a visible god for themselves, the golden calf (Ex. 32:1). Upon such faithless and false worshipers God's judgment comes. Only on the Last Day will our faith be turned to sight. "For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (Matt. 24:27). The Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, and He will gather His people to Himself, both the living and the dead. In a world in which our days are few and full of trouble (Job 14:1), let us comfort one another with these words of the resurrection and the coming of our Lord Jesus.

Hymn of the Day: Preserve Your Word, O Savior

LSB 658

Between 1618 and 1648, Christian Europe endured one of its bloodiest periods and most intense religious battles, known as the Thirty Years' War. This war was waged over differing confessions of faith, as Protestant and Roman Catholic lands fought to retain significant economic and military strongholds, while also expecting their inhabitants to affirm their doctrinal positions. Both sides carried their share of blame, and the loss of life, home and wealth was widespread.

This led to many Christians questioning whether doctrine was important at all. Some grew to believe that if affirming Scripture or church authority led to bloodshed, then neither were worth retaining. They instead suggested we should abandon all beliefs that might cause friction between us and seek the common good. There are two themes interwoven throughout this hymn, both related to God's divine act of preservation: God's preservation of His Word and God's preservation of His Church.

The Lord is with you as He promised to be and He sustains you, not by your great might or wits or resources, but by His Word alone and in His Church alone. Here, through Word and Sacrament, God does His work of conviction, conversion and enlightenment, changing wicked hearts and sustaining souls as we eagerly anticipate His return.
