The Sacrament of the Altar

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church teaches and believes that through the body and blood of Jesus Christ, offered under bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, God gives to His children the forgiveness of sins. Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.

If you are a member at an LCMS parish, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.

If you are a visitor and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.

Distribution - If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow, and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

Join us for Sunday School & Bible Study Sunday morning in the Fellowship Hall. We begin at 9:35am and conclude at 10:30am.

Coffee & Donuts served every Sunday between the early and late service in the Fellowship Hall.

- Hearing assistive devices for worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms are located to the left or right of the Narthex as you enter the church.

Jesus Weeps for Jerusalem

Our Lord wept over Jerusalem for the destruction that would soon come upon her. For she did not recognize the time of God's visitation in Christ, who had come to bring her peace (Luke 19:41–48). Through His prophets God had consistently called His people to turn from their deceit and false worship. *"But My people do not know the judgments of the Lord"* (Jer. 8:4–12). They sought to establish their own righteousness rather than receive Christ's righteousness through faith (Rom. 9:30–10:4). So it was that God was in His temple to cleanse it, a precursor to the once-for-all cleansing from sin which He would accomplish in the temple of His own body on the cross. God grant us to know the things that make for our peace—His visitation in the Word and Sacraments—that by the Holy Spirit we may penitently confess *"Jesus is Lord"* (1 Cor. 12:1–11).

Hymn of the Day

The Church's One Foundation

LSB 644

As Anglican priest Samuel J. Stone (1839–1900) visited the members of his parish, he noticed how pious they were. Many recited the Apostles' Creed in their personal life as well as during worship. Stone wrote twelve poems to aid them in their devotions and published them in a booklet, *Lyra Fidelium* (1866). "The Church's One Foundation" was the ninth poem in it. The hymn was written to explain the phrase "the holy Catholic Church; the communion of saints."

Father Stone was concerned about the spread of challenges to Christianity within the Anglican Communion. Bishop John Colenso of Natal believed the Old Testament was fiction, taught that all people would be saved, and that the Sacrament was symbolic and not the body and blood of Christ. He also permitted polygamy in his African parish. Stone instead supported Bishop Robert Gray of Cape Town, who deposed Colenso. Echoes of this kind of conflict are present in the hymn and remind us yet today of the importance of a true confession and proper doctrine and practice.
