## The Sacrament of the Altar

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church teaches and believes that through the body and blood of Jesus Christ, offered under bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, God gives to His children the forgiveness of sins. Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

- **If you are a member at an LCMS parish**, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.
- **If you are a visitor** and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper until you have spoken with our pastor. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest. If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.
- **Distribution** - If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

### Please see an Usher for help locating:

- Hearing assistive devices for use during worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms are located to the left of the Narthex as you enter the church.
- The Nursery and Cry Room provide quiet places for active or crying children and are equipped to broadcast our services.

**Join us for Bible Study every Sunday morning** in the Fellowship Hall at 9:45-10:30am.

# The Third Sunday after Trinity

## Today's Readings:

Micah 7:18–20

1 Timothy 1:12–17

Luke 15:1–10



## Jesus Receives Sinners

“This man receives sinners and eats with them” (Luke 15:2). The Pharisees’ statement of judgment against Jesus is in fact a proclamation of Gospel truth. For our God is one who delights in mercy, who casts all our sins into the depths of the sea through the cross (Micah 7:18–20). “Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners” (1 Tim. 1:15). Those

who refuse to be counted as sinners also refuse Jesus who came only for sinners. Those like the older son (Luke 15:11–32), who think they are righteous of themselves, will not join in

the heavenly celebration over the sinner who repents and so remain outside of the Father’s house. Let us therefore be on guard against self-righteously trusting in our own merits. “Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time He may exalt you” (1 Peter 5:6). Rejoice that Jesus receives sinners like us and that He still sits at table with us in the Holy Supper, bestowing His forgiveness and life.

## Hymn of the Day:

**Lord to You I Make Confession**

**#608**

Johann Franck (1618–77) was not a member of the clergy. He was a layman, more specifically, a man who worshiped God by serving his neighbor as a Christian lawyer. Out of the heart of this Christian came not only this hymn of confession, but also such hymns as “Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness” (LSB 636) and “Jesus, Priceless Treasure” (LSB 743). Stanza 1 of “Lord, to You I Make Confession” was first published in 1649; four years later the original eight-stanza hymn was published.

In today’s featured text, Franck conveys his contrition and sorrow over sin. Yet he also conveys God’s promise “that for Christ’s sake, sins are forgiven” (AC XII 5). In other words, his words express his personal feelings over his sinfulness.

**Review or learn by heart from Luther’s Small Catechism:** The Lord’s Prayer—Third Petition and Explanations

**Verse of the week:** Luke 15:7b “There will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.”

**Daily Prayer LSB pp 294-298:** Pray and confess out loud.

**Daily Prayer – For Individuals and Families:** As you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Use the one appropriate for the time of day your devotion takes place. Include the Apostles Creed before The Lord’s Prayer if the setting you regularly use does not include it so as to confess it daily. Learn by heart the catechism, and hymn of the week.
