The Sacrament of the Altar

Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church teaches and believes that through the body and blood of Jesus Christ, offered under bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, God gives to His children the forgiveness of sins. Since this is a sacred meal, Advent distributes the Lord's Supper to communicants who have been prepared to receive it.

If communing, please prepare using pp. 308, 329-330 found in the front of our Hymnal.

- **If you are a member at an LCMS parish**, please speak with one of our pastors beforehand so that they may greet you and inform you accordingly regarding our practice.
- **If you are a visitor** and have not been confirmed or hold to a confession of faith that differs from Advent and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, please refrain from receiving the Lord's Supper until you have spoken with our pastor. You may come forward during Distribution to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.
- **Distribution** - If communing, at the appropriate time in the Divine Service, please approach the altar via the center aisle. When directed to a position at the rail, bow and kneel without waiting (you may also stand as needed). After you receive the Sacrament (or blessing), please stand, bow, and return to your pew via the side aisle. The final blessing will be made at the end of the distribution and the covering of the elements.

Please see an Usher for help locating:

- Hearing assistive devices for use during worship are available in the Narthex.
- Wheelchairs are available upon request.
- Restrooms are located to the left of the Narthex as you enter the church.
- The Nursery and Cry Room provide quiet places for active or crying children and are equipped to broadcast our services.

We Praise God for Sustaining Life in and through His Word

The nation resounds with thanksgiving for the earth's bountiful harvest, crops of wheat and grains, all beneath the canopy of God's almighty care. But "man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord" (Deut. 8:1–10). The Church is the vessel through which the Word of God penetrates the world with its Law and Gospel. It is this divine Word which proclaims Jesus as the sole source of life, health, and wholeness. It is Jesus who heals lepers with His Word, "Go show yourselves to the priests" (Luke 17:11–19). Of the ten cleansed, only one expresses thanksgiving back to Jesus. But true gratitude proceeds from a heart sustained by faith. Jesus bids this one Samaritan to "rise and go your way; your faith has made you well." So also, we are sent from the Divine Service, bolstered in our faith by Baptismal and Eucharist blessing to be thankful in our circumstances of plenty and hunger, abundance and need (Phil. 4:6–20).

We Praise You, O God

LSB 785

In our modern mental calendars (the printed ones, too), Thanksgiving always comes before Christmas. Two days off from school as a teaser for the two weeks coming next month. Weather starting to hint of winter with the prospect of real snow coming soon. The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade always ending with the appearance of Santa Claus, officially kicking off the Christmas shopping rush. In the bigger picture, though, Christmas must always precede Thanksgiving. The fact is, without the first Christmas, we'd have nothing for which to give thanks. Appropriately enough, therefore, on the church calendar, Christmas comes near the beginning, while Thanksgiving in both Canada and the United States, though the dates are set by our secular governments, happens to fall near the end. In the United States in particular, Thanksgiving Day is always the Thursday immediately before or after the Last Sunday of the Church Year.

This great hymn of thanksgiving arises from past events. From 1568 to 1648, the Protestant Dutch waged a long and bitter war for independence from Roman Catholic Spain. In 1597 Adrianus Valerius published the hymn "We Gather Together to Ask the Lord's Blessing" to pray God's help in the war against "the wicked oppressing" (st. 1). While it has held immense popularity as a Thanksgiving hymn, its words are quite specific to a military situation, and less celebrate what God has done than ask for future deliverance. Thus in 1902, the organist at Brick Presbyterian Church in New York approached a 20-year-old member, Julia B. Cory (née Cady) (1882–1963), about writing new words that would make the beloved tune more generally useful for a congregation's Thanksgiving service. From the original lyrics, the broad theme of praise carries over. In a lesser way, Cory continues the battle motif of the Dutch hymn (though her "battles we win" has been replaced with "struggles we win" in LSB 785:2). She also picks up the reference to God's guidance.

Every good gift — physical and spiritual, temporal and eternal, earthly and heavenly — is a result of Jesus' cross. And because of Jesus' cross, we have every truly good gift. This means Christmas, which set Jesus on the way to the cross, is indeed before thanksgiving!

Review or learn by heart from Luther's Small Catechism: Lord's Prayer—Introduction and First Petition

Daily Prayer LSB pp 294-298: Pray and confess out loud Daily Prayer – For Individuals and Families as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. 
