

On October 22, 1992 a small but mighty band of Lutheran Christians met in Zionsville to discuss forming a church. A part of the devotion included the words given to St. Paul in a vision at Corinth, Acts 18: "Do not be afraid, keep on speaking, do not be silent. For I am with you, and no one is going to attach and harm you, for I HAVE MANY PEOPLE IN THIS CITY."

OUR CHURCH & SCHOOL

CHURCH EXPANSION

In the last five years, attendance at Advent has grown by almost 20%, offerings increased and we have been debt-free for the last three years. Advent called Dr. Jennifer Siukola as Deaconess to help care for the young and old alike. The addition of groups like "55+", "Young Professionals", "Men's Night" and "Ladies' Night" have been a blessing. Mrs. Kim Knickerbocker, a part-time professional accountant, was hired to ensure good management and financial oversight.

With this growth comes a need for additional space for Sunday School, Youth and Fellowship Events. While our beautiful Fellowship Hall and current classrooms have served us well, we are simply out of space as a growing congregation. Phase III was initially planned in 1999 as the next step in providing additional classrooms and a gymnasium, not just for school use, but also for large events and activities for the church.

SCHOOL EXPANSION

After over 20 successful years of Early Childhood Education, Advent voted to start a School and called Rev. Aaron Schultz as Headmaster and Associate Pastor. In the Fall of 2022 we began offering 1st-2nd grades. Mrs. Katie Schultz was hired to serve as Advancement Coordinator for our new Classical School. In the Summer of 2023, Advent voted unanimously to start a Capital Campaign for Phase III Building Expansion. In the Fall of 2023 we began offering 3rd-6th grades after calling Ms. Elizabeth Paul to teach and 3rd-4th grades and hiring Mrs. Jena Mackay to teach 5th-6th grades.

The support for our School Expansion has been overwhelming with over \$500k given (beyond normal offerings) to support the initial startup cost of staff and school supplies. Thanks be to God!

We will run out of available classroom space in the next two years, so **Phase III** is now a blessed necessity!

PHASE III BUILDING EXPANSION

We are blessed with almost 20 acres of land in an accessible location. Most of our property is in Zionsville with frontage in Carmel. The land, Phase I and II have been completed and paid in full.

Phase III is an approximately 30,000 sq/ft addition to the west of Phase II. It is being designed to include:

- 8 new classrooms and/or offices
- Auditorium/Gymnasium (activity, events, fellowship)
- Bathrooms
- Stage/Areas for Performance & Practice (athletics, music, events)

OUR FINANCIAL PLAN

As with all building and construction, costs can vary throughout the year and according to unforeseen change orders and circumstances. Advent's Building Committee has been working diligently behind the scenes and has secured estimates between \$200 - \$250 psf.

It should also be noted that the layout and dimensions of the plans shown will most likely change in various ways.

Once this Campaign concludes and we know how much we have raised in commitments, Advent will officially meet to decide how much to build and/or borrow!

FUNDING PLAN

IF we do not raise the entirety of our \$7,000,000 goal, Advent leadership believes that we should NOT borrow more than 50% of the total cost. Current interest rates from our own Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) are between 4.87 - 5.25%.

At the conclusion of the Campaign, a Voters' Meeting will be called to decide the most appropriate funding means and model.

APR. 11, 1993

The first worship of the then "Zionsville Lutheran Church", was held at Somer Conference Center, 11707 North Michigan Road, on Easter Sunday, April 11, 1993, with an attendance of 137. Later the church was re-named Advent Evangelical Lutheran Church in January of 1995.



The congregation became eligible for membership in The (LC-MS) Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod with the acceptance of its constitution by the Indiana District Board of Directors on September 18, 1993.

After months of negotiations, a final agreement was reached between the church and the property owners for the purchase

of Bennett Family Farms and a groundbreaking ceremony was held at the church site on August 27, 1995. The congregation intended to hold its first service in the new church on Sunday, May 18th. However, the actual first service occurred on May 17th with a funeral service. It was a service of joy and thanksgiving... Joy in the knowledge of his forgiveness through faith in Christ and thanksgiving for his joys in life everlasting.

AUG. 27, 1995

PHASE I

The first phase of building Advent occurred in 1995, with a ground breaking ceremony on August 27, 1995. Phase I of our history included building the Narthex, Sanctuary, Library, two classrooms & offices.

PHASE II

After 4 years, Advent recognized a need for an Early Childhood Program (preschool & 1/2 day kindergarten). The church had also grown and needed additional space for Sunday School, Youth, Bible Classes and Fellowship events. Groundbreaking occurred in 1999.



SEP. 19, 1999

Phase II included a beautiful Fellowship Hall, Offices, nine classrooms and a small gathering space. Registration for our new Preschool began in 2000, the same year this new space was dedicated.

For almost 30 years these spaces have served Advent in a most wondrous way. Many children from our Church and Community have come through our doors for Preschool, Kindergarten, Sunday School and Youth activities. Our Fellowship Hall has provided for Bible Classes, Banquets, Receptions, Conferences and even indoor play space!

But we have run out of room and are in need of more classrooms and a gymnasium! Will you help be a part of historic Phase III?

Why we are building a private Lutheran school and asking you to support it!

Education is not morally neutral. Education at Advent Lutheran School both forms and catechizes the child for a life of service to his family, the Church and his neighbor. We believe that one of the chief vocations of parents is to train their children up in the fear and admonition of the Lord. The vocation of parents in forming their children and training them in the faith is fully supported by a classical Lutheran educational framework. The classroom mirrors the home where children learn to pray, learn to sing the hymnody, read the scriptures. A classical Lutheran education firmly roots children in the true, the good and the beautiful where children can freely serve and live out their vocation. Their daily life and learning is grounded in objective Truth, academic rigor, integrity and excellence. Christian teachers and friends who have been saved by the Gospel and the waters of Holy Baptism are the norm instead of the exception.

In contrast, postmodern constructivist progressive education determines what is in the best interest of the child and expects the parents to leave decisions concerning education to the school. They are expected to blindly support the pedagogical framework adopted by individual teachers and the local school district. This framework is neither ethically or spiritually neutral. In most instances, it is antithetical to a Christian worldview, authority and ordered governance. The conscience of the Christian child is often burdened by fear of reprisal to openly speak against sin. He is inundated with messaging from his coursework, classroom, classmates, teachers and administrators that what is sinful is actually good and must not just be tolerated, but accepted and celebrated. This is the norm and practice of the everyday life of many students. It is a struggle to find Christian friends and teachers.

Raising children is a blessed task. What a joy it is to walk along side parents, teachers and administrators that share the desire to focus education on Christian character formation, a strong liberal arts curriculum and a rich academic environment that encourages subject mastery and inspires a genuine love of learning. Classical education in a Christian setting supports parents and equips the children to live out their vocations in a God-pleasing way.

At Advent Lutheran Lutheran School, students are cultivated in wisdom, eloquence, and virtue. Our Lord is the Fount of all worthwhile knowledge, and this understanding permeates everything we do in and out of the classroom. We are the inheritors of a rich and wonderful tradition, our Western Civilization. The Western Civilization is a body of ideals and values, from the cultures of Athens, Rome, and Jerusalem, transformed and completed by Christianity. We look outside ourselves to examine, admire, and imitate the best of what our Western Civilization has to offer - in art, literature, history, mathematics, and in all other disciplines. Let them be so well instructed with a liberal arts education illuminated by the Scriptures that our task is made evermore joyful.
